

Kari ran the Design and Construction Consultants Industry Training Organisation until it was merged with Infratrain in 2010. She has run her own business NQF Solutions Ltd for 15 years providing training and assessment services to ITOs, Providers and private organisations. Kari provides CEO services to both the ATI and FloorNZ alongside her other business activities.



Training Manager: Jeff Henry has over 36 years experience in the flooring industry. Starting out as an apprentice with a small contracting business, Jeff gained a wide range of experience over twenty years as the firm grew into one of Christchurch's largest flooring companies. 





Where did people work in 2018?




How many businesses were in the sector in 2018?


How many people were self-employed in 2018?

- ► A category 2 status allows us to:
 - Register training programs with NZQA
 - Access Government funding
 - ► Have a 4 year audit cycle

- Government is committed to improving the skill level of construction workers in the sector.




Allied Trades Institute (funded by BCITO)

- ► ATI exists to provide training to the flooring trade on behalf of the BCITO in areas apprentices cannot receive these skills on the job
- In total the numbers attending training at ATI over the past five years has exceeded 1000
- The ATI designs learning and assessment material specific to flooring industry needs which is referenced to national standards
- Relevance is ensured through constant monitoring of trends from the industry and internationally
- Provides induction courses for retail Stores
- Randomly drug tests apprentices
 - This surprisingly is proving to have a positive influence on apprentices that are wanting to change their habits with many at the stage of life starting their own families. Employers find it also assists their Health and Safety policies in the workplace.







Recent block results



- We are seeing an emerging trend of apprentices struggling at their final block course.
- Where previously this course was honing skills and managed by one tutor, it now requires 2 tutors to split the course.
- The current qualification and assessment process allows some apprentices to achieve a qualification that is well over representative of their skill set.










- Specialisation, particularly in the main centers
- Trends in flooring products
- Challenges in training millennials
- Work overload with the construction boom

How it breaks down









- The skills for sheet vinyl are reducing, as time in the work place is split between residential sheet and planks
- With predominately cut pile carpets installed over the past years, the skill needed for installing textured loop pile carpets has been lost
- Apprentices and employers are increasingly relying on block course training for teaching core basic skills

Industry Trends

- Registered Master Builders 'House of the Year' magazine showcases 87 homes. Over 60 have timber planks in the living/dining areas. The remainder are a combination of polished concrete, tiles and carpet.
- ► FloorNZ partners estimate 50/50 ratio for plank verses residential vinyl; some chain stores are seeing up to 70% increase in plank sales.
- Therefore an apprentice installing vinyl can have their experience halved over three years between planks and sheet. When this apprentice arrives at block course the lack of workplace experience has limited their core skill set.
- This means they are learning new skills at block course. This in turn means extra time has to be spent with apprentices to provide them with skills they are not receiving on the job.



BPG Progress & Next Steps

- ► The Best Practice Resilient floor coverings planning and installation guidelines are on the floor NZ website
- The feedback and involvement from sponsors has been of great assistance, very positive and much appreciated.
- The carpet guidelines are circulating at the moment for comment and will be online as soon as feedback is complete
- Further development that is needed
 - Development of guidelines for Timber and Floor sanding
 - Short online learning aids to help with upskilling
 - Updating the qualification so apprenticeship flows onto licensing/continual professional development
 - Lining the key licencing criteria to the guidelines and flooring qualification
